



Discovering Vietnam

Confucianism, Taoism, and Buddhism have had a significant impact on Vietnamese culture, influencing the nation's traditional values, practices, and manners. Family and community are highly cherished, and reverence for elders and ancestors is strongly emphasized. The country's extensive history is reflected in its literature, art, and architecture, which also display French and Chinese influences. The use of fresh herbs, vegetables, fish sauce, and soy sauce are hallmarks of Vietnamese cooking. A significant part of Vietnamese culture is the traditional music and dance.

The most significant holiday in Vietnam is the Lunar New Year, or Tet, which is observed with a week-long celebration that includes family get-togethers, regional cuisine, and decorations.

Buddhism, Taoism, and Confucianism have a significant effect on traditional Vietnamese values. Traditional Vietnamese culture places a strong emphasis on a number of principles, including:

Families are seen as the cornerstone of society, and filial piety is highly regarded. Family life also includes a lot of respect for the past and for the elders and ancestors.

Community: There is a significant focus on cooperation and supporting one another, and the community is considered as an extension of the family.

Vietnamese people cherish respect, which they show to elders, ancestors, teachers, and other authoritative figures.

Extreme conduct is discouraged, and balance is highly regarded in all facets of life.

Perseverance and hard effort are valued in Vietnamese culture as ways to succeed and uphold one's family and community.

Harmony: The core of traditional Vietnamese values is the pursuit of harmony in interpersonal interactions and society.

Loyalty is highly valued in traditional Vietnamese society, both for one's family and for one's nation.

Simplicity is valued in Vietnamese culture and is regarded as a key component of leading a moral life. It is also associated
